

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs) for ICAR Examinations [AIEEA-UG/AIEEA-PG/AICE-JRF/SRF(PhD) - 2020]

IMPORTANT : All Candidates are requested to read COVID-19 related guidelines/advisory available on NTA website.

This document is merely an attempt to provide answers to some common questions posted to us, by the candidates. However, this list is neither exhaustive nor does it purport to be a source of complete information on the subject. Hence candidates are advised, in their own interest to refer to the “Information Bulletin” on this site, besides referring to the ICAR website for detail information, and ensure that they meet eligibility criteria. FAQs may be referred for a quick reference only.

1	Is there direct admission to ICAR AUs through nomination, without qualifying in AIEEA-UG/AIEEA-PG/AICE-JRF-SRF(PhD)]?	There is no provision of direct nomination for admission through ICAR in any programme without qualifying in AIEEA-UG/AIEEA-PG/AICE-JRF-SRF(PhD)]?
2	What are different modes to apply for AIEEA-UG/AIEEA-PG/AICE-JRF-SRF(PhD)]?	Application Forms can only be submitted through online mode on the website https://icar.nta.nic.in . The Application Form other than online mode will not be accepted.
3.	Can I submit two application forms for two courses at a time?	NO. Only one application is to be submitted by a candidate.
4.	What documents or certificates do I need to upload along with the Application Form?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Candidates need to upload scanned images of photograph, signature, thumb impression, with the Application Form. • No certificates are required to be uploaded along with the Application Form at the time of online submission. • The documents / certificates etc., shall be verified directly at the time of admission in the admitting university.
5.	How can I pay Application Fee?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fee can be paid using SBI/Syndicate/HDFC Payment Gateway through Debit Card/Credit Card/Net Banking/UPI. Candidates need to keep proof of fee paid.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In case the Confirmation Page is not generated after payment of fee then the transaction is cancelled, and amount will be refunded to the candidate's account. • However, the candidate has to make another transaction, in case the Confirmation Page is not generated.
6	Do I need to send Confirmation Page to NTA/ICAR?	<p>The Candidates are NOT required to send/ submit the Confirmation Page of Online Application Form (or any document) to the NTA/ICAR. However, they are advised to retain the following documents with them for any future reference/correspondence:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Copy of the Confirmation Page of Online Application Form (Download, save and Print at least 3 copies) • Proof of fee paid (Download, save and Print at least 3 copies) • Photographs (same as uploaded on the Online Application Form)
7	If I have made any mistake(s) while registering/applying, can I make changes later in the Application Form?	<p>Once 'Final Submit' button has been clicked, the candidate's details cannot be edited/changed.</p> <p>However, NTA shall open the rectification window as per the schedule and Correction in particulars of Application Form can be incorporated on the website only during Correction Window.</p> <p>No corrections shall be allowed after the closure of correction window and all particulars entered by the candidate would be considered as final.</p>
8	I have made the online payment but my confirmation page has not been generated. What to do?	<p>Such problem occurs because of drop in connectivity from Banks' server to the NIC server on which NTA website has been hosted. You are advised to wait for 24 hours if such problem has been faced by you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In case the Confirmation Page is not generated after payment of fee then the transaction is cancelled, and amount will be refunded to the candidate's account. • In such cases, the candidate has to make another transaction, to confirm and complete the application process.

9	I have made the online payment but my status is not updated on the system.	If it is not updated within 24 hours, raise a query in Query redressal system or send a mail at icar@nta.ac.in giving details of your mobile number, application number, payment reference number and proof of payment
10	I have made double payment of exam fee. When will I get the refund of extra payment made by me?	Any extra payment made by you will be refunded to you, within 15 days of the closure of the form submission window, after verification.
11	I carried out corrections and submitted. After submission, I found that still there is some more correction to be done. Can I do so?	After submission of corrections, you cannot reopen the application and add more corrections. Please check the corrections before submission.
12	Why am I asked to pay additional fee after making corrections, in the correction window?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No additional fee is charged for making corrections in the details of application form, if there is no change in the Category. • As amount of exam fee depends on the Category to which a candidate belongs, an additional fee may be applicable in certain cases • Please check the Information Bulletin for the amount of fee payable by different Categories. •

13	How will I get my admit card?	<p>The admit card will be uploaded on NTA website https://icar.nta.nic.in as per the schedule communicated through the website.</p> <p>Candidates need to check the admit card carefully for all particulars eg Roll No. Name, Subject Group, Date of Birth, Gender, Examination Centre Name, City, and Category, etc.</p>
14	If I do not get my Admit Card, whom should I contact?	<p>Toll free Number and email details will be displayed on the website.</p> <p>0120- 6895200; Email for queries: icar@nta.ac.in</p>
15	Whom can I contact in case my admit card has some issue, or I am not able to download my admit card?	In case of any problem related to Admit card, please contact the given helpline numbers between 10:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.
16	Where can I get the name of test centres?	The name of test centre will be mentioned in admit card.

17.	Can I use my friend's email address when registering for?	No, you need to use a valid and unique email address of applicant only. Because, all communications are through registered e-mail id or SMS.
18.	Can I change my test city after receiving admit card?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No, you will not be allowed to change your test city once admit card has been issued. • While applying candidates have to select any four cities of their choice. The efforts will be made to allot city of examination to the candidates in order of the choice opted by them in their application form. Please select your preferred choices carefully. • However, NTA reserves the right to change the city based on the feasibility. • The Examination City Centre, once opted, shall not be changed.
19	What is the reporting time at the centre?	<p>Reporting time starts 2 hours prior to the scheduled commencement of the exam.</p> <p>However, candidates are advised to report as per staggered entry slot mentioned on their admit Card in order to avoid crowd during verification of the admit cards, registration, frisking, etc</p>
20	What is the last time for entry?	Candidates are required to be in the exam centre latest, half an hour before the commencement of the exam.
21.	<p>What documents do I need to carry to the examination centre on the day of examination?</p> <p>What are the things allowed to be carried or not to be carried to the examination centre?</p>	<p>Candidates MUST bring the following documents on the day of examination at the test centre.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> I. Admit Card along with Undertaking downloaded from the NTA website (a clear printout on A4 size paper) II. Any one of the original and valid Photo Identification Proof issued by the government – PAN card/Driving License/Voter ID/12th Class Board Admit or Registration card/ Passport/ Aadhaar Card (With photograph)/ E-Aadhaar/ Ration Card./ Aadhaar Enrolment No. with Photo. A simple transparent pen</p> <p><i>Note: Candidate will not be allowed to take personal items such as mobile phones, digital/analogue watches, food items, study material, lockets, bags, electronic gadgets or any other prohibited items into the testing room. You are advised not to bring these to the test centre.</i></p>
22.	What precaution should I take while carrying document?	<p>The name on the photo identification must match with the name as shown on the Admit Card.</p> <p>If the name has been changed due to events such as marriage, candidate must show the relevant document like Marriage Certificate / Divorce / Decree / Legal Name Change Document at the time of examination.</p>
23	Should I carry a paper to the exam hall for doing some rough work?	<p>No. Blank Sheets for doing rough work/calculations will be provided to the candidates at the exam centre. All calculations/rough work are to be done only in the Blank Sheets provided at the Centre in the Examination Room/Hall. On completion of the test, candidates must drop these rough sheets along with Admit card and Undertaking in the designated box, as instructed by the invigilator on duty.</p>
24	How do I answer questions in the computer based mode?	<p>Detailed guidelines on the Procedure for appearing in computer based tests are given in the Information Bulletin. You may go through them.</p>
25	Will the question paper be bi-lingual or only in English?	<p>The question paper for ICAR-AIEE-UG 2020 will be in English in the normal course. However, Hindi version of the question paper will also be available. A candidate, if he wishes to read the Hindi version of the question paper, he can do so by clicking on the language button on the screen.</p>

		However, question paper for ICAR-AIEE-PG 2020 and AICE-JRF-SRF(PhD) – 2020 will be available in English only.
26	Can I take the exam from any computer?	No, a candidate will have to appear for the exam on a pre-assigned workstation of the test center allocated to him/her mentioned in the admit card.
27.	Can I move back and forth between the questions?	Yes, candidates will have the option to navigate between the questions by following instructions available on the User Interface. They may change even answer options, anytime before they enter submit button.
28.	What precautions do I need to take during the examination?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each candidate has to attempt subject as per the choice in the Application Form. • Please ensure that name of the subject on the screen is the same as per your admit card. In case of any gap please inform Invigilators immediately. • The candidates must attempt subjects as per their choice in the Application, so they must exercise choice carefully. Once printed on the Admit Card it could not be changed. • In case of any discrepancy between English & Hindi Version of a question, English Version would be considered as valid
29.	What if I could not appear in the examination on scheduled date?	No candidate will be allowed to appear at the examination centre/date/timings other than that allotted to them in their Admit card. Important: For those who are unable to appear on the scheduled date of test for any reason, retest shall not be held by the NTA under any circumstances.
30.	Can I cancel the exam?	No, under no circumstances a cancellation / refund shall be allowed.
31.	If I do not take my exam, will I be eligible for a refund?	No, your fees will not be refunded in case you do not appear in the exam.
32	What will I be provided with during the exam?	At the test centre, each candidate will be allotted a desk with a computer terminal and white sheets for rough work.

		<p>Rough work cannot be done on any other paper/sheet, as no other material will be allowed inside the examination room. On completion of the exam, candidates will have to drop these papers in designated boxes as instructed by the invigilator.</p> <p>Every candidate would also be offered a mask. They would be provided material for hand sanitization too.</p>
33.	How do I know when the exam time has ended?	There will be an on-screen timer on the top right corner of your screen which will count down for the allocated time. Candidates are advised to check this timer regularly and allocate their time carefully.
34.	Will I be able to leave early if I finish the exam before the allocated exam time has ended?	No, candidates will not be allowed to leave until the entire duration of the exam is up with the exception of genuine medical emergency.
35.	In case of any technical problems with the computer system, at the exam centre, what should I do? Will I lose time?	NO. In case of any technical problems with the computer at the exam centre, and you are not able to continue the exam, inform invigilator. He/She would fix the issue or will map you to another PC through a proper process. Your exam time in the next session will commence from the time you discontinued your exam, There would be no loss of time for you.

36	Who will determine the final merit list for Admission? How would be the results declared?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Single overall merit-rank list shall be prepared by ICAR. • Category-wise final merit list for counselling shall be prepared based on the reservation category information given by the candidate in Online Application Form. • The result of the entrance examination would be available in terms of overall merit-rank obtained by the candidate declared eligible for registration and choice filling for counseling. • No separate intimation about non-selection in examination and marks obtained therein, will be sent to the candidate.

37.	When is counselling scheduled?	The schedule would be announced by the ICAR on www.icar.org.in after the declaration of result. NTA has no role in counselling.
38	Where can I give free online mock test or practice test?	NTA is providing opportunity to all aspirants to take online Mock Tests, which can be accessed at https://www.nta.ac.in/quiz .

All India Entrance Examination for Admission, AIEEA (UG) 2020 would be conducted for admission to 11 Bachelor degree programmes of four years, in Agriculture and Allied Sciences (other than Veterinary Sciences), at Agricultural Universities on 15% of the University seats (100% seats in RLB CAU Jhansi, NDRI Karnal and Dr. RP CAU Pusa, Bihar).
2	Who are eligible to take AIEEA (UG) 2020 ?	Indian Nationals of at least 16 years of age as on 31.08.2020 are eligible to apply for the examination, if they fulfill all the eligibility conditions laid down in the Information Bulletin including percentage of marks obtained in the 10+2 examination. In case the candidate is found not-eligible at any stage, his/her candidature would be summarily rejected and admission will be cancelled.
3	When will be AIEEA (UG) 2020 conducted?	Candidates are advised to visit NTA website to check updates about date of examination
4	How long is the examination?	Duration of the examination is 150 minutes (2½ hours).
5	What is the test format of AIEEA-UG 2020? How many questions would be there in the test?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each test would consist of 150 questions (items), 50 from each subject. • All Questions shall be Multiple Choice with 4 options.
6	What subject areas are assessed in the test?	Test is administered in 5 subject areas.- Physics (P), Chemistry (C), Biology (B), Mathematics (M) and Agriculture (A).

		<p>Candidates need to choose 1 subject group out of four available groups made out of these subjects, viz.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PCM • PCB • APC • ABC, as per their Eligibility Conditions for different UG Programs mentioned in Annexure-IV of the Information Bulletin.
7	Is there any negative marking?	<p>Yes. Scoring pattern is given below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 marks for each correct response • -1 mark for each incorrect response (negative scoring) • 0 for non-attempt
8	What is the syllabus of the Examination?	<p>The Questions in the test shall be based on the syllabus prescribed by the ICAR, which is available at the website www.icar.org.in.</p>
9	In which cities would be AIEEA (UG)-2020 conducted in India?	<p>The AIEEA (UG)-2020 examination for the academic session 2020-21 will be conducted at 178 cities all over the country. (Please refer to Annexure-I of the Information Bulletin)</p>
10	What precaution is necessary while taking the examination?	<p>Candidates need to ensure that they are taking test in the same subject that is printed on the admit Card (one of PCM/PCB/APC/ABC), that they have chosen as per their Eligibility Conditions for different UG Programs mentioned in Annexure-IV of the Information Bulletin. Attempting different paper would lead to rejection of the candidature.</p>
11	What is Number of Seats Available for Admission through AIEEA (UG)-2020.	<p>Number of seats available for admission through AIEEA (UG) in different disciplines at accredited Agricultural Universities (including non-accredited RLBCAU, Jhansi and some non-accredited programmes and colleges of Dr. RPCAU, Pusa) for the academic session 2020-21 will be displayed on ICAR website www.icar.org.in at the time of counseling.</p>
12	Is there direct admission to ICAR AUs through nomination, without qualifying in AIEEA-UG?	<p>There is no provision of direct nomination for admission through ICAR in any Bachelor degree programme without qualifying in ICAR AIEEA (UG).</p>
